The Inquisition and the Roman Catholic Church.

The inquisition was a group of institutions within the government system of the Catholic Church whose aim was to combat what they considered to be heresy. It started in the 12th century and continued through to the 15th Century. During the late Middle Ages and early Renaissance, the scope of the inquisition significantly expanded in response to the Protestant Reformation, and the Catholic Counter-Reformation and expanded to many other European countries.

Except within the Papal States, the institution of the inquisition was abolished in the early 19th century, after the Napoleonic wars (1803–1815), fought between the first French Empire under Napoleon and a fluctuating array of European coalitions, and after the Spanish American wars of independence.

The institution survived as part of the Roman Curia (also known as the Curia), which is the term used to refer to the system of government that assists the Pope in Rome in executing his global duties for the Roman Catholic Church. It was first established by Pope Urban II in the 11th century when the administrative organization that aided the Pope in carrying out his duties began to take a more organized form. Overtime the responsibilities of the office grew and became more complicated, so did the structure of the Curia in Rome. Under Pope Urban II, the cardinals were placed as heads of the offices of the Curia, they are the central body that continues to carry out the following duties and responsibilities of the Curia today:

- The constitution, divisions, worship and preaching of the Gospel.
- The pastoral care of the family, care of the elderly and the promotion and safeguard of human life.
- Setting and planning the churches goals and mission, and dealing with any other changes.

In 1908 the Roman Curia was given the new name of, "Supreme Sacred Congregation of the Holy Office," and in 1965 was given the name, "The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith."

In summary: the Roman Curia comprises the administrative institutions of the Holy See and the central body through which the affairs of the Roman Catholic Church are conducted.
