## The King of Tyre and a Cherub.

The following verses show that the LORD referred to the King of Tyre as a cherub.

• Ezekiel 28:14-15: The signet of perfection, full of wisdom and perfect in beauty. <sup>13</sup>You were in Eden, the garden of God; every precious stone was your covering, <sup>14</sup>You were an anointed guardian cherub. I placed you; you were on the holy mountain of God; in the midst of the stones of fire you walked. <sup>15</sup>You were blameless in your ways from the day you were created, till unrighteousness was found in you.

Ezekiel also says, the king of Tyre was the signet of perfection, full of wisdom and perfect in beauty (Ezek. 28:11), but in the abundance of his trade and wealth, became full of violence and pride saying, "I am a god, I sit in the seat of the gods" (Ezek. 28:2-5), so the LORD cast him as a profane thing from the mountain of God (signifying Jerusalem), and cast him, the guardian cherub to the ground. (Ezek. 28:16-17), because Tyre treated all Israel's neighbors with contempt.

After this Ezekiel continues his prophecy saying, "Israel will no longer suffer hurt, for the LORD will gather the house of Israel from the peoples among whom they are scattered, and manifest His holiness in them in the sight of the nations. Then they will dwell securely in their own land, and build houses and plant vineyards and know that He is the LORD their God. (Ezekiel 28:24-26).

The king of Tyre is a good example of the rise of the final world ruler who Paul titled, "The Man of Lawlessness," to great power and authority over the nations and his abundant wealth through global trade and commerce (especially over the seas) and his dramatic fall from such glory.
