My Testimony.

Though I had a good family and enjoyed my work and my life when I was twenty, I began to search for more meaning to life. I thought there must be something more than just working, partying sleeping and dying so I started reading books on ESP and self-hypnosis, believing at that time that the something more must be some type of supernatural power of the mind. I read many books on ESP, self-hypnosis, the power of positive thinking and anything relating to the human mind until I read a book by Billy Graham titled, World Aflame. Though there may be much in the book today that I might not agree with, at that time in my life when I had no knowledge of God at all Billy Graham's book, World Aflame showed me that the messages and prophecies of the Bible were just as real today, as they were two-thousand years ago, this amazed me. Since I had always thought, "What possible use could a book written two-thousand years ago have for anyone today?" I read more books by the same author and later went and brought a rice paper black leather-bound gold edged King James Bible. At that time, I mistakenly believed if the Bible didn't have these qualities it was only a book and not a proper Bible.

Then for about eighteen months each night, with the aid of the Daily Union Scripture booklets I began to read the Bible I had brought. Later I had a desire to go to a church, I went to one that was close to me, but no one talked about God once the service was finished and I had a multitude of questions I wanted to ask and the minister wore a black robe and white collar so I thought, "What would he know about me?" I was still living a worldly life. After about six weeks of attending this church a friend took me to an Assembly of God church. To my pleasant surprise they did nothing else but talk about God, their excitement about knowing God thrilled me and after two-weeks a beautiful married couple asked if I would like them to come around and teach me the Bible, I was thrilled and excited to say the least. Church meetings were held in rented warehouses not church buildings and no one cared what people wore (as long as it was modest and not sexually provocative). This was about forty-five years ago, moving outside of stained glass window cathedrals and listening to ministers who dressed in plain clothes and not holy robes was a totally new and exciting spiritual thing in those days and those seeking God and not religion embraced it by the thousands since in those days the teaching was focused upon God's grace and the heart and not outward appearances, ceremonial rites and religious customs and tradition.

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MY CONVERSION

After attending the AOG church for about six weeks, I responded to an altar call fully aware I was a sinner before God and on that altar call, I received Christ as my personal Lord and Saviour, soon afterward I was fully immersed in water and baptized. There was singing, tongue talking and all sorts of things going on around me, but none of it mattered, because I knew that this was between me and God, it was not a decision I had made easily. I knew it was a total surrender of my life to God and to Christ at that moment. When I came to Christ the only thing I knew of the Bible was the message of the cross and the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ and that though I was a decent man according to the world's standards I was fully aware that I was a sinner before God and because of this I wanted to know the man who suffered and died on the cross for me. Other than the basic salvation message I knew very little of the Bible and believed the man behind the pulpit was next to God and knew everything from cover to cover and because I had been a man of the world believed all who belonged to the church congregation were holy (yes I was honestly this naive). Since I had a great love for Christ and zeal to know him, I embraced with naïve zeal everything the pastor and elders taught fully believing they knew the Bible far better than I did which of

course they did since I knew very little except that it was God's book and holy. It never entered my mind in those early years to think that perhaps not everything I was being taught was Scripturally correct. When I look back there are many good memories, during worship services there were young and old men who would stand praising God with tears in their eyes whose lives were completely changed from worldliness to being totally committed to serving the Lord. There were teenage girls who came into the worship service dressed in mini-skirts and heavy make-up (it was the fashion then) who lessened their make-up and lengthened their skirts not because they had been told, but because they grew in the love of Christ and desired to live their life before him and not according to the influences of the world. I did enjoy many years of fellowship with other zealous Christians and learnt a lot that was right, but also a lot that was wrong, but amongst all the error I did find the Lord Jesus Christ and God's grace. I was in Pentecostal churches for seventeen years, the Baptist church for ten and then spent a few years visiting various other Christian churches.

I found that in each Christian church that confesses Jesus there are many things that are good, beneficial and spiritually healthy and certain other things that were not so health-giving. From my personal Christian experiences, I have come to believe that our spiritual Christian life is very much like our mortal life in that we are forever growing. From the first day of honest heartfelt surrender to God I believe that those who are faithful begin a spiritual journey in the love of Christ and God's grace that is forever growing in the fruits of the Spirit and forever growing in the Lord's wisdom, prophetic understanding and Scriptural knowledge and will be forever growing in all these things until the Lord returns in glory.

Because of this my mindset now is not limited to any one particular Christian church, denomination or religious institution, but rather I see myself as belonging to the global worldwide body of Christ made up of men and woman of all nation's languages and cultures and live in the total confidence that the Lord knows those who are his which means I do not have to judge or concern myself with another brother or sisters salvation, but rather focus on encouraging, showing grace and mercy and teaching what is right.
