1,260 Days, 42 Months, and 3½ Years.

- **Revelation 12:6:** and the woman fled into the wilderness, where she has a place prepared by God, in which she is to be nourished for 1,260 days. The 1,260-day prophecy is found in two passages in Revelation.

The 1,260-day prophecy is found in two passages in Revelation.

The first says:

- The Gentiles will trample on the holy city for 42 months. And I will appoint my two witnesses, and they will prophesy for 1,260 days, clothed in sackcloth.” (Rev. 11:2-3).

Then, as part of a symbolic vision says:

- The woman fled into the wilderness to a place prepared for her by God, where she might be taken care of for 1,260 days.” (Rev. 12:6).

In Scripture this period is referred to as:

- 1,260 days.
- 42 months (Based on the Jewish Calander of 30 days in a month).
- 3½ years. (Based on the Jewish Calander of 30 days in a month).

The following is not a dogmatic theory, since there is a variety of ideas amongst scholars and theologians concerning the 1,260 days, and it is certain all prophecy will become clearer as we move closer to the Lord’s return. I (as do many others) believe this prophecy concerning the 1,260 days, is still to be fulfilled in the latter days, and that the 42 months refers to the last 3½ years when the seven angels pour out the seven vials of God’s wrath (Rev. 16:1-21).

Prior to this horrific time of worldwide fear, terror, upheaval, and destruction, the redeemed in Christ will have been caught up in the first resurrection (Rev. 20:4–6), for God has not destined the redeemed in Christ for wrath, but to obtain salvation through the Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Thessalonians 5:9).

NOTE: the many detailed prophecies contained in Scripture are part of what makes the Bible unique among religious texts, for it not only informs us of the beginning of the world, but also informs us of the end of the world, and its governments, its corrupt oppressive banking systems, its false religions, and its wars, violence, and all forms of corruption.
