37 Verses Supporting Security of Salvation.

The following 37 verses, show that all are saved by grace not works, and that the faithful redeemed in Christ can be secure in their salvation.

- 1. **Isaiah 64:6:** We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away.
 - Even in our best moments, our righteous works are like a polluted garment
- 2. Mark 16:6: Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned.
- 3. **John 3:16:** "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.
- John 3:36: Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him.
- 5. **John 8:24:** I told you that you would die in your sins, for unless you believe that I am he you will die in your sins."
- 6. **John 11:25:** Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live.
- Acts 16:31: And they said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household."
- 8. Romans 3:20: For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.
- 9. **Romans 3:28:** For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.
- 10. Romans 4:3-5: For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness." Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as his due. And to the one who does not work but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness.
- 11. Romans 6:23: For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.
- 12. Romans 5:1-2: Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God.
- 13. **Romans 6:24:** And are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.
- **14. Romans 10:9-10:** Because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved.
- 15. Romans 8:1: There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.
- **16. Romans 9:16:** So, then it depends not on human will or exertion, but on God, who has mercy.

17. Romans 10:3: For, being ignorant of the righteousness of God, and seeking to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness. ⁴ For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.

They do not understand that no human being is able to achieve the level of God's righteousness.

- **18. Romans 11:6:** But if it is by grace, it is no longer on the basis of works; otherwise, grace would no longer be grace.
- 19. 1 Corinthians 6:9-11: Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. And such were some of you. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.
- 20. 2 Corinthians 5:1-5: ¹ For we know that if the tent that is our earthly home is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. ² For in this tent we groan, longing to put on our heavenly dwelling, ³ if indeed by putting it on we may not be found naked. ⁴ For while we are still in this tent, we groan, being burdened—not that we would be unclothed, but that we would be further clothed, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. ⁵ He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit as a guarantee.

In this tent we groan: the groaning refers to the longing to free of sin.

Being found naked: means being found without the covering of Christ righteousness

21. 2 Corinthians 5:6-9: So we are always of good courage. We know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, ⁷ for we walk by faith, not by sight. ⁸ Yes, we are of good courage, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. ⁹ So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him.

Walking by sight: means we are at some level we are trusting in ourselves and works.

Walking by faith: means we are fully trusting that we are saved, not by works, but by faith in Christ.

Our aim to please him: this is the aim of all those redeemed in Christ.

22. **2** Corinthians 5:10: ¹⁰ For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil.

This judgment involves three judgments:

- Those who are saved being rewarded
- Those who are saved suffering loss, but still being saved.
- > Those who are cast out.

Based on number three, many faithful Christians redeemed in Christ, cannot say they are saved, which means they have no faith (i.e., confidence), in the following four:

- > In what Jesus achieved for them on the cross.
- Jesus blood washes them clean.

- They are saved by Christs righteousness being imputed to them, and not their own self-righteousness.
- > God's grace is not enough to limit them.

Now let us examine who Jesus casts out, Jesus said:

➤ On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' ²³ And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.' (Matthew 7:22–23).

The ones being cast out are not faithful Christians who have loved God, loved His Beloved Son, and faithfully followed him for years, but workers of lawlessness (iniquity in KJV). It is very likely this refers to those who fit the following three groups:

- > Those who proclaim the Gospel for their own glory, worldly riches, and importance.
- Those who twist and distort the Scriptures to appeal to the masses to enlarge their own ambition for fame and religious empire.
- Those who confess to believe in Jesus, attend church on Sundays, but give God no thought during the week and live as they please.
- 23. Galatians 2:16: Yet we know that a person is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, so we also have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ and not by works of the law, because by works of the law no one will be justified.
- 24. Galatians 5:6: For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision counts for anything, but only faith working through love.
- 25. **Ephesians 2:8-9:** For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.
- **26. Ephesians 2:10:** For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.
- 27. **Ephesians 2:4-8:** But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, ⁵ even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— ⁶ and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, ⁷ so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. ⁸ For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God.
- 28. Colossians 2:12: Having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead.
- 29. 2 Timothy 1:9: Who saved us and called us to a holy calling, not because of our works but because of his own purpose and grace, which he gave us in Christ Jesus before the ages began.
- 30. Titus 2:11: For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people.
- **31. Titus 3:5:** He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit.
- 32. **Titus 3:7:** So that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

- **33. Titus 3:8:** The saying is trustworthy, and I want you to insist on these things, so that those who have believed in God may be careful to devote themselves to good works. These things are excellent and profitable for people.
- 34. **Hebrews 2:3:** How shall we escape if we neglect such a great salvation? It was declared at first by the Lord, and it was attested to us by those who heard.
- 35. **Hebrews 5:8-9:** Although he was a son, he learned obedience through what he suffered. And being made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him.
- **36. James 2: 26:** For as the body apart from the spirit is dead, so also faith apart from works is dead.
- 37. 1 John 5:4: For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith.
