ANIMAL SACRIFICES

NOT THESE ARE IN ALPHEBETICAL ORDER

Animal sacrifices: were cut into four distinct parts, each signifying the following aspects:

Fat: signify a believer's general vigour and health.

Head: signify a believer's thoughts.

Innards: signify a believer's emotions and feelings.

Legs: signify a believer's walk.

BURNT OFFERINGS

NOTE: every part of a burnt offering was put on the altar and totally consumed by the fire.

Bull, the lamb, and the goat: sacrificed as burnt offerings signify the following characteristics:

Bullock/bull: signifies untiring labour in service to others, likewise the sacrificed bullock signified Christ's untiring labour in service to others.

Goat: signifies strong-minded leadership.

Lamb: signifies uncomplaining submission even in suffering.

Turtledove: signifies humility, meekness, and mournful innocence.

RANDOM

A hen gathers her brood under her wings: signifies shelter and protection. (Luke 13:34) (Matt. 23:37).

Calf's foot: signifies strength and endurance.

Calf (ox in the KJV): signifies enduring patience under suffering and work.

Eagle: (nesher) signify three things:

- 1. God's will, being carried out.
- 2. Protecting the faithful
- 3. Punishing the unfaithful.

Lion: ('ariy) means to pierce, and signifies the following three ideas:

- 1. Violence, to pluck up and remove quickly.
- 2. Strength and fortitude.

Ox (shuwr) (a bullock): carries the idea of turning or travelling about as a merchant or a labourer and worker.

3. King and head of countries and nations.
