Common people embraced the following:

- · A person whose land or property was owned by another.
- · Farmers.
- A worker in a skilled trade, especially one that involves making things by hand.
- Those who work in street markets selling handcrafts, painted ceramics and leather goods etc.
- A person or company that produces something (such as cheese or wine) in limited quantities.
- Merchants in general.
- The masses.
- A student who pays for their own board.
- A person who did not have any significant social status.
- Blue-collar workers, common people, lower class, peasant.
- Low-level priests.
