Great White Throne Judgement of God.

Judgement according to works.

• Revelation 20:11-13: Then I saw a great white throne and him who was seated on it. From his presence earth and sky fled away, and no place was found for them. ¹² And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne, and books were opened. Then another book was opened, which is the book of life. And the dead were judged by what was written in the books, according to what they had done. ¹³ And the sea gave up the dead who were in it, Death and Hades gave up the dead who were in them, and they were judged, each one of them, according to what they had done.

After the faithful in Christ have been raised in the first resurrection, and reigned with Christ for a thousand years (Rev. 20:4-6), we read: when the thousand years are ended (Rev. 20:7), God descends on a great white throne, the sea, death, and Hades give up the dead and they are judged. The book of life is opened, if anyone's name is not found written in the book of life, they are immediately thrown into the lake of fire, this is called the second death. Then for those whose names are found in the book of life other books are opened, and they are judged according to what is written in these books, according to what they have done. From these verses it appears whoever's name remains in the book of life, are not case into the lake of fire, but judged according to what they have done, most likely according to the law of love. (Rev. 20:11-15).

These verses shine a spotlight upon the truth, all must stand before the judgment-seat of God, and every human life will appear in its true light, stripped of all deceptive outward adornments which have hidden the true nature and motive of the heart. No one will be judged by rank, success, riches, or achievement, but according to their works, as it is twice stated in Revelation (Rev. 20:12-13). This general judgment is the final vindication of God's righteousness before the whole world, which in this present mixed world of good and evil, has not been visibly and clearly manifest. This final and great white throne judgment of all mankind will manifest to the world that God is Holy and just.

The judgment of everyone who stands before the Great White Throne will be greater or less in proportion to the degrees that they have attained to Christs command, "Love your neighbour as you love yourself," meaning do good to all people and not harm. No sane person deliberately sets about to inflict harm or hurt upon themselves, but rather do all they can to avoid all forms of hurt, the law of love and of God calls us to treat others in this same way. The words, "according to what they had done (according to their works in KJV)" (Rev. 20:12-13) means, according to whether their acts, conduct, intentions, affections, and actions, had been agreeable or disagreeable to the natural law of love. Meaning, did they treat everyone with honest judgment, kindness, compassion, and respect and do good to all people in contrast to inflicting hurt and harm upon others, being unjust and showing no kindness mercy or compassion.

God's judgments are true, just, and righteous because:

- God will purge away whatever is against Scripture and against the law of love.
- The judgments that come upon the wicked are deserved.
- God through His prophets and His word clearly warn, that all will be judged.

• God perceives the true motives, and intents of the heart.

Though God's judgment is delayed it will be accomplished at its appointed time, for He is the ever-living and unchangeable God, and though His judgment is not immediately accomplished, it does not mean that God has abandoned His people or His judgments.

FOUR OLD TESTAMENT JUDGMENTS OF GOD

• Ezekiel 14:21: For thus says the Lord GOD: How much more when I send upon Jerusalem my four disastrous acts of judgment, sword, famine, wild beasts, and pestilence, to cut off from it man and beast!

The four judgements God used to bring judgment on His people Israel were:

- 1. Famine.
- 2. The sword.
- 3. Noisome beasts. Today, noisome beasts, may embrace individuals out of control and gone wild), manifested in senseless killings, civil riots, and the rise of minority groups imposing their agenda on other, such as the LGBT movement imposing their agenda on all mankind.
- 4. Pestilence.
