The Hebrew and Greek Meaning of Angel.

Angel in the Old Testament comes from the Hebrew word, Malak, and means to dispatch as a deputy, a messenger, an ambassador, or a representative it can apply to and angel of God, a king, a prophet, a priest or teacher. The same word is used for the supernatural angels of God, and for human messengers which means it can apply to God's supernatural angels or human men who are sent as messengers.

Angel in the New Testament comes from the Greek word, Aggelos, and means a messenger or envoy sent from God to bring tidings. Aggelos is used all, of the time in the New Testament for the supernatural angels of God (except for Luke chapter twenty) but it is also used for human men (i.e., pastors, ministers, and such like) which means aggelos can apply to God's supernatural angels or human messengers.
