Horns.

INTRODUCTION: animals that have horns use them to wound and kill their prey, or to defend themselves from enemies, therefore horns signify kings and armies protecting themselves and destroying their enemies.

Depending on the context horns also signify:

- **Horns in general:** signify, great power, authority, and dominion, especially of kings, rulers, and heads of nations.
- **Horns of a wild ox:** signify tribes and people that are self-willed unruly and go their own way.
- **Horns of iron:** signify powerful kings and heads of nations and armies that subdue and destroy fierce enemies.
- **A single horn:** signifies the great strength of a ruler or nation.
- **Four horns:** signify four powerful kings and their armies.
- **Ten horns:** signify ten antichristian nations and their rulers that will reign in the latter days.
- **Two horns:** of a ram signify two powerful nations.
- **Seven horns:** clearly horns are a symbol of power and strength, which means seven horns signify great power, strength, authority, and influence.
- **Ten horns:** as a collective and united force, ten horns signify even greater power strength, authority, and influence than the seven horns.
- **God and horns:** when horns are associated with God, they signify perfect power and strength used to carry out His full and perfect will.

SCRIPTURES THAT SPEAK OF HORNS

- **Deuteronomy 33:17:** A firstborn bull (the tribe of Ephraim and Manasseh) he has majesty, and his horns are the horns of a wild ox; with them he shall gore the peoples, all of them, to the ends of the earth.

Here horns are a symbol of ruthless armies destroying people and kingdoms.

- **1 Kings 22:11:** Zedekiah the son of Chenaanah made for himself horns of iron and said, "Thus says the LORD, 'With these you shall push the Syrians until they are destroyed.

Here horns are symbols of power and weapons of war.

- **Jeremiah 48:25:** The horn of Moab is cut off, and his arm is broken, declares the LORD.

Here the horn is a symbol of a powerful king (now defeated).

- **Zechariah 1:18-19:** I lifted my eyes and saw, and behold, four horns! ¹⁹And I said to the angel who talked with me, "What are these?" And he said to me, "These are the horns that have scattered Judah, Israel, and Jerusalem."

Here horns are symbols of four powerful kings.

- **Daniel 7:24:** As for the ten horns, out of this kingdom ten kings shall arise, and another horn shall arise after them; he shall be different from the former ones, and shall put down three kings.

Here horns are a symbol of eleven kings with great influence and power.

- **Daniel 8:20:** The ram that you saw with the two horns, these are the kings of Media and Persia.

Here the two horns are symbols of two kings with great authority and power.
