Leprosy and the Blood of Two Birds for Cleansing.

- **Leviticus 14:5-7:** And the priest shall command them (the leprous person) to kill one of the birds in an earthenware vessel over fresh water. ⁶ He shall take the live bird with the cedarwood and the scarlet yarn and the hyssop, and dip them and the live bird in the blood of the bird that was killed over the fresh water. ⁷ And he shall sprinkle it seven times on him who is to be cleansed of the leprous disease. Then he shall pronounce him clean and shall let the living bird go into the open field.

Following are some of the possible symbolisms concerning the two birds:

The first bird that was killed: signifies Jesus' death.

The second bird: was dipped in the blood of the first bird that was killed, and then set free to fly away, may signify either of the following two things:

1. Christ shedding his blood to cleanse sinners and afterward ascending into heaven.
2. A sinner being washed in the blood of Christ and being set free from sin and death, as the leper was set free from the disease of leprosy and death by the blood.

The lepers cleansing: since it was only after a leper's body showed a change for the better that the priest gave orders for a sacrifice to be offered, it is very likely that the lepers cleansing, signifies a sinner must be in a state of faith before salvation, and the benefits of the Gospel can be enjoyed.

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The many sprinklings of blood upon the leper: signify that a believer must do all they can to cleanse themselves from all behaviour, speech and actions that dishonour God and bring a bad testimony to the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the Christian faith.

The dipping into blood: dipping the cedar wood, the scarlet ribbon, and the hyssop, into the same blood, most likely signifies the following truth: whether one is noble, rich, or lowly, or born a descendant of Abraham, or of a foreign nation, all must be cleansed in the blood of Jesus to enter the Kingdom of God.
