Seven.

The number seven is a full number which signifies:

- Perfection and completeness.
- The power of God over the world.
- The complete circle of God's power in judgment.
- The endless, boundless, manifold, diversity of the operations of the life-giving spirit that flows from Jesus Christ.
- The number seven is often used symbolically to represent the power of God over the world, and signify the complete circle of God's power in judgment.
- The number seven is a fitting number for the blowing of the seven trumpets, since it is the number for perfect completeness and the events following the blowing of the seventh trumpet, brings about the end of God's wrath, and removes all obstacles and hindrances to Christs Kingdom of righteousness, justice, joy and peace coming on earth.

Seven times: carries the idea of magnification, and making a thing seven times clearer and brighter than they normally would be.

It implies:

 Great perfection and magnification of spiritual light, happiness, blessedness, and joy. 0

- Great magnification of the truth that is being taught.
- The complete cleansing and removal of all sin and guilt by blood.
- Sprinkling the blood of the guilt offering seven times, indicates the complete removal of all guilt, and of all sin, by the blood.
- Sprinkling the oil seven times signifies, being filled with the Holy Spirit, and the light of God and His word, and the love and grace of the God. (Leviticus 14:14-17).

Following are seven graces God poured out on Jesus:

- 1. He was chosen to be the glorious exalted Son of God preeminent in all things. (Col. 1:18).
- He was chosen to be the redeemer that reconciles to God all who are alienated. (Col. 1:22-21).
- 3. He was chosen to be the head of the body, the church. (Col. 1:18).
- 4. He was chosen to be the Saviour who reconciles to himself all things on earth and in heaven. (Col. 1:20).
- 5. He was chosen to be our heavenly High Priest seated at the right hand of God. (Ephes. 1:21).
- 6. He was chosen to be the Lord far above all rule, authority, power, and dominion, and above every name that is named in this age and the age to come. (Ephes. 1:21).

7. He was chosen to be the eternal King who will put all things under his feet. (Ephes. 1:22).
